Around The Classes



The Woodlands (Aspen Class and Beech Class)

This week in the Woodlands we have been looking at the traditional tale of Rapunzel. We have used a version which is set in India. The children have had lots of discussions about the differences and similarities of life in India compared to England. We built towers using various equipment, we have looked at comparing height and length. We built a tower using milk crates and used our problem solving skills to be able to call up to Rapunzel at the top. We have painted our own faces and looked carefully at our skin, eye and hair colour. We have got a lovely display of our faces which the children can show you on World Book Day!



Cherry Class

Another week has whizzed by! This week in Cherry class we have been thinking lots about what it means to be collaborative. We have lots of opportunities at school for teamwork and our lessons often involve pair and group work. The children have been thinking about what it means to work collaboratively with others and why it is important to be able to work as part of a team. Sycamore Class

What a busy and fun week Sycamore class has had. In our DT this week, we began our new unit about structures. The children enjoyed working in groups to complete the challenge of building the tallest, self-supporting structures that they could. We were really impressed with how well some of the children worked collaboratively to create their structures. Within our lesson we looked at some of the tallest buildings in the world. We set the challenge of finding out what the world's tallest building was and how tall it was. I was impressed with the number of children that did this research at home and we also learnt that Ronnie had been to the top of it! Can your child remember the building? Can you find out about any of the other tallest structures in the world?



Juniper Class

This week in Juniper class we have been continuing with our exciting learning, following up on Juro8 the alien, and learning more about climate and weather. To start off the week we began by looking at the 5 times table, multiplying numbers by 5 and then eventually sharing, dividing numbers by 5. Can your child tell you what 45 divided by 9 is, or maybe what 5 x 5 equals? Afterwards, in English, we learnt what a report is and did our own research in order to gather more information for Juro8. We worked collaboratively to read through reports about our world, making notes as we went. Finally, in RE this week we started to learn about the events of Holy week, sequencing them in chronological order. Good job this week Junipers! Have a nice weekend.



The Dunes Class





We are pleased to announce that FONS has organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for FONS

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 1999 it has now paid out over £48 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for FONS, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill.
