The Woodlands (Aspen Class and Beech Class)

We have been writing instructions for how to create a woolly mammoth this week and have learnt to include lots of exciting things such as adverbs and imperative verbs. In Maths we have been learning about fact families, learning to write number sentences in different orders. Finally, we have been preparing for our Harvest service at the church by singing lots of songs, creating Harvest pictures and discussing what Harvest means to us.
