# Around The Classes

#### The Woodlands (Aspen Class and Beech Class)

This week in the Woodlands we have been looking at the book, "What's in the Witch's Kitchen?" We have discovered lovely things we might like to eat and really disgusting things we wouldn't want to eat. Some of our words this week we have been learning are: surprise, escape, delicious and courage. Ask your child if they can remember what these words mean. In maths we are looking at length. Can your child do some measuring at home? They could bring in their recordings to go up on our maths wall. In forest school we looked at "What's in the Witch's Wilderness" we found lots of squelchy mud, snails, flowers, blossom on a tree and slugs and spiders.

**Cherry Class** 

It was lovely to welcome the children back this week and hear all about their half term. On Wednesday this week, we started our cricket sessions. This is something we will be taking part in for the rest of this term. The children seemed to really enjoy it and were very enthusiastic. We will just have to keep our fingers crossed for better weather in the coming weeks. This week in our science we have begun learning about the human body and over the next few weeks will be exploring and learning about the 5 senses. Have a great weekend.

It was lovely to welcome the children back this week with smiling faces and see how surprised they were to see how the tadpoles had grown over the holiday. In English the children were excited to receive a note from a mysterious visitor who wanted to know more about where we live. The children worked hard to answer some of his questions and really thought about using detail to describe. On Wednesday we had a fantastic cricket session. The children really enjoyed the different activities and we are keen to see how they progress through the term. In Science the children were learning about what a habitat is. They are excited about going out to explore habitats around the school. What was your child's favourite part of the week?

#### Juniper Class

It's been a great first week back for Juniper class, and it's been fantastic to come back after a few weeks off to everyone being so enthusiastic! So, thank you Junipers! We kicked off the week on Tuesday by reading our new English book called "Here we are", and discovered an Alien had crashed landed near by, so we had to start using descriptive language and extending our sentences in order to give Juro8 (The Alien), as much information as possible about where he is. In maths, we have been looking at our 10 times table, as well as dividing by 10. Can your child tell you the answer 7X10=? Or perhaps 40 divided by 10? Finally, this week we began to look at our new RE topic, where we discussed why Spring might be an important time for Christians, we even created our own posters of things we are thankful of during springtime. Thank you Junipers for a great first week back!

#### The Dunes Class

This week in the Dunes, we started to learn about climates in Geography. We started to think about what we already know about different climates, and different weather. In Science, we began our new unit, 'Living things and their habitats'. We discussed some habitats that we already knew. In Art, we experimented with different methods of painting. We learnt how to use watercolour paints. We also used cotton buds to paint dots and created pictures of rainbows!
