The Woodlands (Aspen Class and Beech Class)

Another great week in Sycamore Class. It has been so lovely to see so many children show kindness and thoughtfulness towards friends and the adults. The children enjoyed their second swimming lesson and we were so impressed with their attitudes and willingness to have a go. It was also lovely to have so many parents accompanying us for this - thank you. In science this week the children were learning about animals and their offspring. In history they were continuing learning about the events during the days that the Great Fire of London burned. What can your child remember?

Juniper Class

This week Junipers have been hard at work which was obvious by the amazing learning that they did. In RE this term, we have been focusing on Islam and specifically this week we discussed one of the five pillars, Hajj. The children were fantastically able to recall all the five pillars, their names and what they stand for, perhaps your child can tell you one of the five pillars? Specifically, though, we looked at Hajj, and how Muslims must go on a Pilgrimage once in their life to Mecca. Secondly, in Science this week, we finished identifying different groups of animals, as well as finding out why some baby animals look like their parents, and some do not. We followed this up by looking at whether this has anything to do with being born in an egg or not. Finally, in PSHE we discussed what values you need to be able to achieve goals that you might set yourself, using our learning powers as guidance when deciding. We carried this out by creating a picture of ourselves completing a particular goal, and the learning power that was used alongside it.

The Dunes Class

In the Dunes this week, we have started our new Science topic 'Animals including Humans'. We started by thinking about what is alive, not alive, and used to be alive. We made collages of Tudor houses and added flames to represent the Great Fire of London. We started to learn about why Samuel Pepys was an important historical figure. We also began constructing our own 3D Tudor houses!
