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### Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers,

What a very up and down weather week it has been this week. Still, the wet weather has not stopped us from getting out and about! On Tuesday the Year 1 children enjoyed their second session of beach school and despite the rain, the children had a great time. Mrs O'Sullivan has asked me to put some pictures of the turtle enjoying the amazing shelters that the children built.

A reminder about mobile phones. I would kindly request that you do not use your mobile phones when on the school site at drop off or collection times. I also request that mobile phones are not used when supporting school trips and events. There are occasions throughout the year when you are permitted to take pictures of the children (church services, sports day and Christmas plays). A member of staff will always say when you can take pictures. If in doubt, please ask before using your device. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

I have been asked recently by parents about children wearing earrings in PE lessons. To clarify, children are not permitted to wear dangly earrings or hoops to school. If your child does have pierced ears, they are only allowed to wear a small stud. The children can wear studs for PE lessons as the risk of injury is very low. The biggest risk comes from if they get hit in the ear by a ball. Our advice to parents is to wait until your child is old enough to be able to take out their own studs before getting their ears pierced. If your child can take out their own studs and you are concerned about the risk of injury in PE lessons, please send a box for your child to put them in on PE days and speak with your child's class teacher.

#### The Woodlands

This week in the Woodlands we have been looking at the cartoon Fraggle Rock - The Terrible Tunnel. The children have been making tunnels and testing out different objects in our various tunnels. In maths we have been looking at the teen numbers and using the language of 'tens' and 'ones'. We have continued our work on growing and our broad beans have begun to sprout. We have had a great time in Apple class this week and the children have worked hard across all areas of their learning. In Science we are continuing our learning on plants, we have been learning about the difference between wildflowers and garden flowers and to name and identify some common ones. Sycamore Class have been working really hard this week. In English they have continued to work hard on Badger's challenges. This week they have been writing our class story about a revolting ice-cream. They worked hard to use lots of description and think about interesting word choices. In maths we have been continuing with learning about fractions. We have been impressed with how well the children have been applying their knowledge in these sessions. It has also been great to see so many children bring in fraction work that they had done at home! #### **Juniper Class**





We are pleased to announce that FONS has organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for FONS

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Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 1999 it has now paid out over £48 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for FONS, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.
