The Woodlands (Aspen Class and Beech Class)

Can your child name some of these around the house? We looked at a cube, cuboid, sphere, pyramid and cone. This week was our last Forest School. A big thanks for all the help collecting items for our DT lessons. The children have made some fantastic vehicles with moving wheels. They have all seemed to really enjoy building them. In our science this term we have been learning about the 5 senses and this week we have had a great time tasting, smelling and feeling different objects and trying to guess what they are without using our sense of sight. The children are all super excited for our trip on Monday - fingers crossed for some sun! Have a great weekend.



Sycamore Class

This week in Sycamore class the children have been making magic potions in maths. The children had to follow a special dragon's recipe which encouraged them to explore volume and capacity. They have learned how to measure out different volumes of liquids. In English we have started to write our own version of George and the Dragon. We have focussed on including noun phrases and conjunctions at the beginning of our sentences. Sycamore class really enjoyed making songs in ICT, thinking about how to make patterns with notes and how to adjust the tempo to suit their tune. We are all really looking forward to our trip to the Eden Project on Monday 25th March! Next week is our final week before we break up for Easter, we have our Easter service on Thursday 28th March to look forward to.



Juniper Class

It's been a great week for Juniper class this week! We started the week by beginning to create noun-phrases based on a picture of a dragon from a new book we had not read! It was amazing to hear some of the sentences the children created about this dragon! We later read our new books of George and the Dragon, and George, the Dragon, and the Princess. Next, excitingly in maths, we have been looking at measurements, specifically using millilitres, where on Thursday we had to measure out ingredients in order to make a magic potion! The children had a great time and their measurements were spot on! Finally, this week in computing and music, we created rhythms on computers to represent animals whilst their partners guessed what animal the music was about. Well done Junipers for another great week, one more to go!



The Dunes Class

This week in the Dunes, we have continued to learn about habitats. We created our own microhabitat and are waiting to see if any creatures make it their home. We learnt about the three most diverse climates- polar, desert and equatorial, and made a poster to show what animals and plants live there. In DT, we started to learn about structures and have experimented with how to make things stronger and more stable.



We are pleased to announce that FONS has organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for FONS

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 1999 it has now paid out over £48 million.
