### Our learning this week

## The View from our Blogging Team

In Year 3 this week, they made a mountain out of shoe boxes and drew pictures of volcanoes. It was a blast... Of magma! In Year 4, they were making pictures of hot and cold animals. In Geography they were learning about the North and South pole. It was very *cool!* 

In English, they were reading a book called Running Wild. For year 5, they were learning about earthquakes and tectonic plates. Luckily they didn't have their dinner on those particular plates! They were also learning about the inner core, outer core and the earth's crust. No, not bread crust! Year 6 were doing bench ball and gymnastics in P.E. In English, they were learning and writing about dragons! Luckily they didn't burn the pages with their fire writing!

In Year 3, we have been learning about inversing which means doing the opposite! We've used it to check our answers and make sure that we are being accurate. In writing, we've continued to write our story about the legend of Black Rock. We were surprised to find out that it's actually a friendly creature and we've been finding out ways to show this as a writer. In our afternoon work, we have been learning about types of rock and tested them based on different criteria. We have also been learning about mountain and volcano formation and have made a mod-rock model which we have also painted. The classrooms became quite messy but we had a lot of fun!

In Year 4, we have been learning about different climates around the world. We have explored the difference between climate and weather while also investigating why certain animals live in certain parts of the world. In maths, we have been using different images to explore the relationship between addition and subtraction and have produced some fantastic work in RE! Another very busy week!

In Year 5, we have been working on our gymnastics routines ahead of the virtual competition. We've had fun investigating and measuring gravity using force meters. We've started learning about Islam and the importance of the 5 pillars.

This week in Year 6 we have been working hard on our maths, moving from place value onto common factors. In English, we have been practising lots of different writing skills that we will need for next week when writing about a mythical beast we created. In PE we are continuing to work on our gymnastics routines for the upcoming virtual competition.
